Objectives

EIT Urban Mobility is an initiative of the European Institute of Innovation and Technology (EIT). Since January 2019 EIT Urban Mobility has been working to encourage positive changes in the way people move around cities in order to make them more liveable places. It aims to become the largest European initiative transforming urban mobility. Co-funding of up to € 400 million (2020-2026) from the EIT, a body of the European Union, will help make this happen.

Urban Mobility: Initiatives and Services

EIT Urban Mobility extends support to cities in the implementation of sustainable urban transport strategies. This includes expertise, funding, and collaboration opportunities. By promoting innovation, research, and living labs, the organization encourages the development and deployment of innovative mobility solutions. Furthermore, EIT Urban Mobility facilitates public-private partnerships, knowledge exchange, financial backing, policy alignment, data analysis, and advocacy to promote sustainable mobility across Europe.

Target Groups

EIT Urban Mobility integrates key mobility stakeholders across Innovation, Business, and Academia, fostering collaboration and knowledge transfer. This initiative engages cities as innovation test beds, empowers citizens for behavioral change towards liveable cities, and educates students and professionals to bridge knowledge gaps in urban mobility entrepreneurship and innovation. It also supports SMEs, startups, and scale-ups in creating and scaling sustainable businesses. Academia conducts exploratory research, while industry partnerships drive the global deployment of proven mobility solutions.
