

Marie Skłodowska-Curie Postdoctoral Fellowship (Global Fellowship)

The Marie Skłodowska-Curie Postdoctoral Fellowships (PF) enable talented researchers to work on projects in Europe and beyond. They aim at enhancing the creative and innovative potential of Postdoctoral Researchers through advanced training and international and inter-sectoral mobility. They are open to all domains of research and innovation, from fundamental research to market take-up and innovation services.

Global Fellowships are open to researchers currently within or outside Europe who want to move to a Third Country (TC, outgoing phase) and then come back to an EU Member State or Associated Country (MS or AC, return phase).

How does it work?



A proposal is submitted by a postdoctoral researcher jointly with a host organisation in Europe (academic or non-academic sector) in response to a call for proposals. Successful proposals receive funding for up to three years for an initial outgoing phase and a mandatory return phase of 12 months. The European host organisation receives the money and recruits the awarded researcher.

Who can apply?



Most promising **postdoctoral researchers** from EU member states or countries associated to Horizon Europe wanting to diversify their competences, acquire new skills and go abroad. Postdoctoral researchers must hold a PhD at the call deadline and have no more than 8 years research experience after their PhD. For Global Fellowships, a mobility rule applies to the TC where the future host organisation is located: eligible researchers must not have lived, worked, or studied in the TC for more than 12 months during the 3 years prior to deadline. The duration of the fellowship is 24 to 36 months.

What does the funding cover?

The EU contribution covers the individual costs of researchers as well as organisational costs.

How much money is in it?



The financing is based on unit costs where a researcher month is one unit. It is composed of **living allowance** (€5080/month adjusted through a country correction coefficient), **mobility allowance** (€600/month) and **family allowance** (€660/month- if applicable) as well as **research & training costs** (€1000/month) and **management costs** (€650/month).

Benefits?



For researchers:

- Advanced training and mobility
- 100% funding
- Recognition of excellent science
- Increase of career prospects

For host organisations:

- Access to talent
- Recruitment of highly skilled researchers
- Enlargement of international networks
- Transfer of knowledge

When can I apply?



The 2023-MSCA-PF call opens on **12 April 2023** with a deadline on **13 September 2023** (17:00 Brussels time).

How do I apply?



The PF call is published on the [Funding and Tenders Portal](#), from where you can also download the important documents (e.g. Guide for Applicants and Work Programme) and start your submission.

What is the success rate?



The overall success rate for the European Fellowships was between 14% and 23% in the different calls in H2020 and the first call in Horizon Europe.

When will I know the outcome of the evaluation?



The proposals will be evaluated from October to December 2023 and the outcome will be known at the earliest by March 2024. The approximate date for signing the Grant Agreement and starting the project is May 2024.
